WINE REGIONS	 Climate: Continental (low annual temp but July/Aug very hot) Large lakes moderate extremes Freezing winters = perfect conditions for Icewine
ONTARIO (3 DVAs)	Niagara Peninsula SW of Lake Ontario. Cools down/heats area slowly. Extends growing season/delays spring budburst (minimises frost damage). Air flow = reduces fungal disease Riesling = dry/off-dry/fresh/fruity. Icewine. Vidal (hybrid) = high quality Icewine (not as aromatic/acid structure as Riesling) Chardonnay = dry/restrained/no oak PN/Cab Franc/Cab Sauv/Merlot
BRITISH COLUMBIA (5 DVAs)	Okanagan Valley ❖ Between two mountain ranges (low annual rainfall/semi-desert) ❖ Long day length (northern latitude) = prolongs the time for photosynthesis - grapes ripen ❖ Large glacial lakes moderate temperature and extend the growing season. White grapes (N) + black grapes (S) ❖ Merlot/PN/Pinot Gris/Chard. Icewine - Riesling/Vidal

Canada Wine Laws

- Appellation system = **Vintners Quality Alliance (VQA)** (Ontario/BC)
 - Smaller Designated Viticultural Areas (DVAs)
 - Regional appellations and subregional appellations
 - o 100% of grapes from VQA province/V. Vinifera or hybrid
