





Wine regions

- Climate: Continental (low annual temp but July/Aug very hot)
- Large lakes moderate extremes
- Freezing winters = perfect conditions for Ice wine

Ontario (3 DVAs)

Niagara Peninsula

- SW of Lake Ontario.
 - Cools down/heats area slowly.
 - o Extends growing season/delays spring budburst (minimises frost damage).
 - Air flow = reduces fungal disease
- Riesling = dry/off-dry/fresh/fruity. Ice wine.
- Vidal (hybrid) = high quality Ice wine (not as aromatic/acid structure as Riesling)
- Chardonnay = dry/restrained/no oak
- PN/Cab Franc/Cab Sauv/Merlot

British Columbia (5 DVAs)

Okanagan Valley

- Between two mountain ranges (low annual rainfall/semi-desert)
- Long day length (northern latitude) = prolongs the time for photosynthesis grapes ripen
- Large glacial lakes moderate temperature and extend the growing season. White grapes
 (N) + black grapes
 (S)
- Merlot/PN/Pinot Gris/Chard. Ice wine Riesling/Vidal

Canada Wine Laws

- Appellation system = Vintners Quality Alliance (VQA) (Ontario/BC)
 - o Smaller Designated Viticultural Areas (DVAs)
 - Regional appellations and subregional appellations
 - o 100% of grapes from VQA province/V. Vinifera or hybrid
